Stay Tuned - We had just one new puppy join us this quarter but more are expected before the end of the year.



It's been a busy quarter at the kennel. Our trainers are working hard at advancing skills for all the dogs in the kennel, as well as keeping up with the puppies and their puppy raisers and the advanced dogs with their fosters.















FROM THE OFFICE OF OUR CANINE PROGRAM MANAGER

Did you know that SMSD administers the following behavioral and performance assessments to dogs between the ages of 1-2 years old? Through the use of standardized assessments, our team can identify specific strengths and weaknesses for an individual dog. Each dog in training is placed on an individual training plan.

These assessments enable us to provide critical information to the breeders who provide dogs to the organization. It also justifies whether a career change for a dog is needed before additional resources and funding are allocated. Each assessment is progressive in nature for behavioral criteria and performance expectations.

Level 1/Week 4- Conducted on Site/The dog is handled by the assigned trainer. Dogs are introduced to various textures and basic retrieval tasks, learn or advance basic position skills, learn targeting behavior and are introduced to distance, distractions and duration.

Level 1/Week 8- Conducted in Public & on Site/The dog is handled by the assigned trainer. New position and manipulation skills are introduced, all previously taught skills are applied in public settings.

Level 1/Week 16 - Conducted in Public & on Site/The Dog is handled by someone other than its assigned trainer. New manipulation skills are introduced. All new and previously taught behaviors are applied in public settings.

Level 2- Conducted in Public & on Site/The Dog is handled by someone other than its assigned trainer. Advanced mobility tasks are introduced: searching for a phone, cane retrieval, alerting that help is needed. All previous skills are applied in public settings, Final C-BARQ (Canine Behavioral Assessment & Research Questionnaire) assessment is administered.

Once a dog passes a Level 2 assessment, it is considered ready to be paired with a veteran. Dogs that are not yet paired to a veteran may be moved to a volunteer advanced foster home or live part time with a staff trainer. During this time, we expect to apply all skills learned in the home and public settings until the dog is paired to a veteran applicant.



Thank you to SMSD, Volunteers, and sponsors for your continued support.



When asked what brought her to SMSD, she says it was the mission and the people (our trainers and other volunteers). Gale says what keeps her involved is, again, the people – veterans, other volunteer handlers, excellent trainers – all dedicated to the mission. She also appreciates the fiscal responsibility shown by SMSD.

Her background as the child of a military family has given her an appreciation and respect for our veterans. Her business management degree and raising of seven children helped her develop communication and organizational skills to prepare her for the SMSD volunteer roles. Gale brings a lot of dog experience, both as a breeder and trainer of Chesapeake Retrievers beginning in 1975, and showing her own dogs in conformation, obedience, rally, and other dog sports.

When Gale was asked the difficult question: Do you have a favorite dog? She was quick to respond, "The dog at the end of my leash is my favorite, but every dog has a piece of my heart." Good answer, Gale! Each dog, (Freedom, Buster, Tucker, current advanced foster Tango, and current puppy Seymour) have a very special place in her heart. Her enthusiasm has prompted two of her daughters to join as well as another friend to become a puppy raiser. Her contacts in the dog world have led to volunteers to conduct dog visits and out-of-state PATs.

She reports that when she shares the mission of SMSD, to help our wounded veterans, people seem to straighten up a bit and show more respect towards the dog and herself. Gale is proud of her work, and the work of all volunteers, which results in our veterans and their families living a fuller life and having the freedom to participate in community activities.
